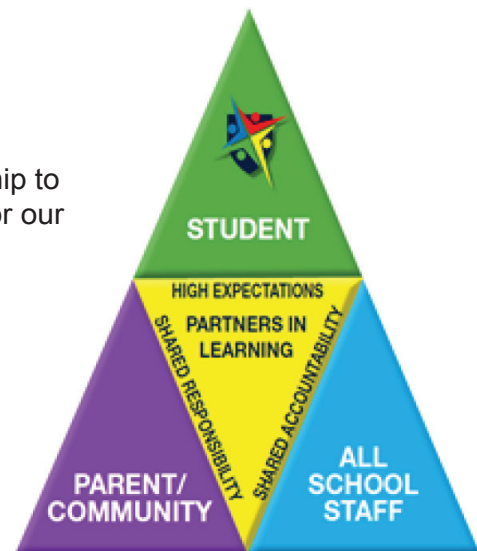
## LEARNING AND BEHAVIOUR STATEMENT

## WHOLE SCHOOL APPROACH TO DISCIPLINE

## ATTENDANCE MATTERS

School absenteeism and truancy can impact significantly on students' learning and wellbeing. Research shows that in Queensland, higher student attendance is associated, on average, with higher student achievement. Additionally, attending school every day helps children to build social and emotional skills such as communication, teamwork and resilience. Under the law, students enrolled must attend school on all school days unless there is a reasonable excuse. Schools must monitor attendance of students and follow up with parents and caregivers any unexplained absences.
